My thoughts for the week Maybe I am putting my farming/gardening hat on now. It is something that comes naturally to me as I was brought up on the farm. Every year has its season. Each month, week and day likewise. Some of us may have a favourite season of the year because of the various festivities we celebrate but I am thinking beyond these. I am thinking more of nature governed by the length of the days with the daylight hours and it's increasing warmth in the latter part of Spring. I would say this would be a special part of the year for me which is beginning now and is from mid May to the longest day (21st June) Up until mid May we are so busy preparing the land and then sowing and planting the many vegetables and flowers. Over the next three weeks or so most of the remaining tender plants should be cared for, for a bit longer because of the danger of the possibility of late frosts.

The reason I believe this to be the special part of the year for me is that God always rewards me/us for the efforts we put in. I never cease to marvel at the speed of growth over this period of the year and as soon as the days shorten then the plants begin maturing and then ripening until the season of harvest (only about four months away!) You will note from last weeks notices that we have just passed the season of Rogation when we celebrate God's wonderful creation. We remind ourselves of how much we depend on the crops in the fields and farm animals for our food, as well as remembering so many other blessings. In my younger days the church I attended would hold their annual Rogation service in a hilly field nearby. Before I finish I would like to draw attention to the need of perseverance and patience if we expect reward. We have the small seeds that need tender loving care. We all have different gifts so may we thank God for the ones we have. How many of you saw the Coronation concert two weeks ago and saw Lucy who is blind with other problems; And how fantastic was her playing of the piano! There were people that recognised her gift and it was their gift of love and patience that was rewarded. May we thank God for their love, patience and
