We will only be here a couple of days but we will all get a huge benefit from the visit especially as they have no family of their own to offer direct support.

Strangely on the drive up to Manchester there was a programme on the radio about a convicted drug dealer and general all round bad guy who was converted to Christianity whilst in prison and then proceeded to be derided and mocked by his fellow prisoners. His conversion seemed quite genuine and it seemed to me to be not that dissimilar to John Newton, who Mary Krawczenko wrote about last week, who ended his time as a slave trader when he was caught in a storm in the Atlantic ocean.

We no doubt all have our stories to tell about how our faith affects our lives and our relationships with others and I think it is often in the little things that it has the most impact. We can look at instances when we have been tested and reflect on how we have dealt with those times. Are we content with our actions or could we have done more? I think we could use this time of reflection to try and set our path to aim for a better outcome more often.
