Amen My thoughts We have recently celebrated Epiphany, which by definition is, "an intuitive grasp of reality through something (such as an event) usually simple and striking".

I can't help thinking that is exactly what Paula Vennells (Ex Chief Executive of the Post Office) had following the recent screening of Mr Bates vs The Post Office on Itv. If you haven't watched it, get it on catch up either directly or via a friend, it is truly harrowing to see what those sub-postmasters were put through between 1999 and today, 24 years and counting. I know there are plans afoot to rectify the error but for 24 years plus the establishment stood their ground and refused to accept that they had done anything wrong. It may not be the worst miscarriage of justice to ever happen and when we consider what is happening in Gaza, Ukraine, Afghanistan, and other parts of the world the impact is relatively minor, but it is still wrong.

We celebrate Epiphany as the realisation that God had come to earth in the form of Jesus and he would show us the way to eternal life. That option is still available to us, to anyone who believes. Since Jesus, there have been many "Epiphany Moments" through science, Archimedes discovering how to calculate the size of an irregular article or Isaac Newton grasping the impact of the gravitational pull on the moon and falling apples on earth. Amazing though these are they don't hold a candle to the promise made by Jesus that if you truly believe you will inherit eternal life. I struggle daily to get my head around this. I understand the Post Office fiasco. I get gravity, but eternal life!!!! That is a buge chal-

Office fiasco, I get gravity, but eternal life!!!! That is a huge challenge for anyone to try and comprehend. It is a massive leap of faith that many of us would like to make but have we got the resolve to believe it is true. I would like to think I would say "yes I believe", but not just to make life easy/comfortable but because I can see the truth in what Jesus preached.

I have little time left to correct some of the wrongs I have committed but I pray I can do some good in my latter years that will help to sway the pendulum. As for "Epiphany", I don't think I have had mine yet but I can see the impact of those who have.
