So I googled the following:-

Gratitude is a positive emotion that involves being thankful and appreciative and is associated with several mental and physical health benefits. When you experience gratitude, you feel grateful for something or someone in your life and respond with feelings of kindness, warmth, and other forms of generosity.

When we listen to The News maybe this is part of the problem in our society today!

According to Colossians 3:17, we're to thank God in every word and action: "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." Speak every word in gratitude, and do everything with a thankful heart.

In some ways it may not seem important to say 'thank you'; on the other hand it warms our hearts when we receive the compliment.


