

#### **Update from Tessa Munt, MP**

Since becoming your MP, I've highlighted some of Somerset's unique cultural contributions, including signing an 'Early Day Motion' celebrating our annual tradition of Wassailing. I believe it is crucial that the Government strengthens its support for cider producing orchards in Somerset to ensure fair prices throughout the supply chain. In Parliament, I've spoken in debates on a variety of matters concerning local residents - opposing EDF's proposed saltmarsh at Kingston Seymour (now paused, happily!) and supporting the continuation of the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (now extended for one more year). I have pressed the Government on, for example, the need for broadband that works well for rural residents and businesses, the value of community energy projects, the madness of building on flood plains without proper mitigating measures, sewage pollution in our waterways, making developers put solar photovoltaic panels on every new roof possible (the so-called 'Sunshine Bill' introduced by Max Wilkinson) and Roz Savage's Climate and Nature Bill. #### **20 MPH for Congresbury**

Many of you may be wondering 'What happened to that Petition I signed for a 20 MPH speed limit through Congresbury' a while back?

A concerned resident who lives in Brinsea Road started the petition and after gathering over 850 signatures out of a village of 3400 a small steering group was formed to take the idea forward.

The group then sought guidance from Dan Thomas, Ward Councillor for Congresbury, in the method needed to present any proposal to North Somerset Council.

Traffic volumes, speeds and vehicle types were recorded, and the group then made a presentation to the Parish Council asking for their support. The Parish Council already had a proposal which they had made to NSC in 2021, and the

steering group's data boosted that. Since then, NSC had prepared their Active Travel Plan 2023-30 and Congresbury were in that plan for 20 MPH.

The committee were encouraged by this and so with the help of Dan, pressure was maintained and NSC brought this proposal to the Consultation stage.

Now comes your bit... As Congresbury residents we urge you to support this proposal, to improve safety and quality of life whether you live in the Kent Road, High Street, Brinsea Road or any of the surrounding areas. Log on to <a href="https://n-">https://n-</a>

somerset.inconsult.uk/congresbury before the 11 April to have your say and support this proposal.

Our understanding is that the 20MPH Zone will cover all roads within the village between the 30mph sign on the south side (Langford approach) up to the south A370 traffic lights and Kent Road and all roads leading into it on the north side. Associated speed restriction measures are proposed along Brinsea Road including raising the Zebra Crossing. It will not apply to the A370 main road.
