The Methodist Church in Congresbury was first held in a tiny cottage half way up Kent Road and my first memory of it was a family of four living in it called the Bateman family. Dad was a chimney sweep and he could be seen walking around Congresbury pushing his bike with

all his sweep brushes tied on it. We would love to watch as his brush appeared at the top of the chimneys and a great shout of hurrah would go up from all the children watching. Sorry I digress! When the tiny church became too small another building just at the entrance of Kent Road which belonged to the Sheppy family, became home to the chapel while the work then started on the Chapel that is now still in use, and as you know we celebrated 150 years only a couple of weeks ago. So all this meant that Methodism has been happening in this village for 175 years. It really makes the mind boggle, doesn't it? I only wish some of the older generation were alive still to tell us some of their stories. Sadly Jean Darby who only recently passed away used to tell us such wonderful stories. Unfortunately I can only go back seventy five years and sadly our church was badly flooded when we had the Village Flood in 1968 and because of this any early photographs and paper history was spoiled beyond repair, and like so many my memory seems to be getting less and less helpful so this is the best I can offer.

In the Bible it says 'build me a house so I may worship my God often' and my hope and prayers are that worship will be fulfilled in our church for many, many years to come.
