My thought for the week We are days away from celebrating the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and if ever there was a need for someone to come and show the world that there is a better way to live our lives, now is the time. The current wars around the world may not be as woeful as some historical events in terms of numbers of lives lost, but given the wars we have had in the last 100 or so years and for centuries prior to that, we must wonder why and how we, the human race, have managed to survive and what we have done that is worthwhile to justify our existence. That sounds very demoralising but I do think we need to take a long look at ourselves and try and take a turn for the better. I know the current bias in news articles is always to those that generate shock and unsettle us and there are definitely a lot of good things going on that will never get reported but we must try and rebalance events so that the good has to be reported. It was wonderful to hear that good news story about the girl in London who has had blood transfusions to correct an imbalance in her blood that meant without treatment she might already have died. Showing how ordinary people with seemingly little influence can make a positive difference to the hopes and outcomes of other ordinary people.
