Thought for the week When I was a child an old aunt of my father's lived with us. She would spend a long time telling me Bible stories, my favourite was Jonah and the whale, which I am sure was many a favourite of children. Recently I reread the story, basically it was about Jonah not accepting what god wanted him to do. He tried to run away to Spain instead of going Nineveh to deliver Gods judgment to the people living there-as he had been asked. It made me think, do we ignore what god wants us to do if it makes us uncomfortable? Would we go and work with people on the streets if we felt it was what God wanted us to do or would we make all the excuses and reasons why really we couldn't do it?

Jonah realised that we cannot hide from God so after being shipwrecked, spending several days in the whale's belly he asks for forgiveness and God spews him onto the beach. He then goes to Nineveh and carries out what God had asked him. We cannot run away from God.

The whole story I believe is about asking for forgiveness if we do not carry out what we are asked by God to do, that is difficult to recognise but with prayer and opening our minds to our Lord Jesus we know we can ask to be forgiven and as our God is a loving forgiving God we are truly loved and forgiven, without question. In the same way we need to live our lives thinking of others, forgiving others who hurt us and trying very hard to make a difference in this world. With the Lords help I feel we can.
