My thoughts for this week

God is the Holy Trinity of 3 Entities: God the Father, God the Son and God the Spirit. In order for us to comprehend the love of God, we need to embrace the truth of the Holy Trinity. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth...and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters."(Genesis 1:1,2). "Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness"(v26). By this, we know that God created humanity lovingly in His own image so that we could enjoy His new creation.

Sadly, we fell short of God's love because of our sinful nature. His love again reached out to us through the incarnation of His son, Jesus Christ. "In the beginning was the Word (John 1:1) . .The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us."(v.14). God became man to bridge the gap between God and humanity, to deliver us from sin and restore our relationship with God. Jesus confirmed his own part of the Trinity in his final prayer: "Father! Give me glory in your presence now, the same glory I had with you before the world was made." (John 17:5)

When Jesus completed his mission on earth, he assured his disciples that "...the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you" (John 14:26). As the Holy Spirit speaks into our hearts and minds, it inspires us, directs us and encourages us when we struggle in our faith and in our prayers. It gives us discernment to recognise the true voice of God. The Holy Spirit is the very presence of God, the legacy of His love. God's love does not stop at the cross but continues each and everyday until we reach the Father's House and then for eternity. Romans 8:38,39 - "...neither the present nor the future...nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8:38,39).
